YOUTH NATIONALS

Entries Open for Youth Nationals

It is the premier event on the calendar for Youth sailors in the Britain, and it is coming soon, to a place near you.

You can enter now for the 2009 RYA Youth National Championships and Trials at Largs by visiting www.ryaracingevents.org.uk .

The 2009 Championships are being staged at Largs Sailing Club from Sunday 12 to Friday 17 April. The event is guaranteed to attract Britain's top Youth racers to do battle in Scotland.

Promising windsurfer Izzy Hamilton will be looking to retain the RS:X girls' title she first won at Pwllheli last year while fellow 2008 victors James Grant and Sophie McKeernan will hope to repeat their success in the boys' and girls' Laser Radial events.

2008 RS:X European class silver medalist Ali Masters will want to go one better than his RS:X boys' National silver last year, Phil Sparks and Ben Gratton, 2008 bronze medal winners, will also be hoping to continue their progress in what is set to be a very tight 420 class.

For the first time in 2009 sailors who turn 19 between September 1 and December 31st can now enter the Championships while also being eligible to apply for National Youth Squad places and international travel grants for Open age events.

The Championships act as an indicator for sailor support for the relevant class Youth World and European championship events this summer and count as a selection event for the 2009 Volvo Youth Sailing ISAF World Championships being held in Buzios, Brazil in July.

Optimist News

The Optimist Major Events season got off to a flying start for Scotland. Four of our Squad members travelled south to Weymouth (WPNSA) for the new Spring Championship. This is a new event on the IOCA (UK) calendar. Although this is not a ranking event it was extremely well supported, with some excellent racing in light breezes. The light breezes were not to everybody's taste: at the top end of the fleet attention to boat setup - particularly the sail - is crucial.

With the entrants split into Gold and Silver fleets based on 2008 final rankings, with newcomers automatically in Silver fleet, Scotland had Callum Airlie, Alistair Gray and Ross Stanley-Whyte in Gold Fleet, with 'new kid on the block' Jamie Calder in Silver Fleet. Two days of racing was planned - and the full complement of 6 races took place. Some excellent results saw young Jamie win Silver fleet - and almost having to pay excess baggage on the flight home for the silverware. Callum achieved 10th place in Gold Fleet, with Ali just outside the top 20 with a 21st. Ross bettered his End of Season ranking by 10 places, coming 57th.

Well done to all of you. Good luck for the rest of the season. Look out England - the Scots are coming!

Disabled sailing boosted by Atlantic crossing

RYA Sailability Scotland are the grateful recipients of funding generated by a sponsored sail across the Atlantic, giving disabled sailors the chance to develop their skills with specially targeted workshops, and disabled individuals the chance to try sailing.

Dave Sturrock, who sailed on 'Flyer of Lorne', a 40ft Hanse 400 yacht, took 20 days and 2 hours to cross the Atlantic as part of the 'Atlantic Rally for Cruisers' sailing race, which runs from Gran Canaria to St Lucia. Dave and his four crew decided to raise money for RYA Sailability Scotland on the way, as sailing is very much a passion for them all. 'We wanted to give something back to a sport that has given us all so much enjoyment' says Dave, who lives in Oban, and owns 'Flyer'. 'Thankfully we had really great weather throughout the race, which makes everything so much easier to manage, and we're really delighted with the support we have had to allow us to raise so much money for disabled sailing'. CRUISING

Tips from The Green Blue on Anti Fouling

"Tips to minimise your environmental damage."

1. Topside paints, antifouling, varnish, used brushes, rollers, trays and solvents are all hazardous waste and should therefore be disposed of accordingly.
2. The key is to prevent antifouling from unnecessarily entering the water. Skirt the hull when scrubbing down or painting the hull and use a tarpaulin to catch the flakes and drips. Don't leave a coloured patch under your hull!
3. If washing off on a slipway, use a device such as a loop of rope to catch any paint particulates and then sweep up and dispose of as hazardous waste.
4. Look into alternative hull paints such as hard vinyl, silicone or Teflon , which are suitable for in water hull cleaning systems.
5. Dust from sanding paint and antifouling coatings is toxic. Using a dustless vacuum sander will also protect your health.
6. If you use scrubbing piles, only scrub off the fouling and not the residue paint- be careful not to let the old or new paint enter the water.
7. Select a marina, club or boatyard which has a closed loop scrub down facility which collects residues from wash down.
8. Select the right type of antifouling for your craft and boat usage- take advice from your chandlery. Use water based paints where possible or low Volatile Organic Compound (VOC) paints.
9. Apply the right amount of antifouling required and do not spill it- when applying, use a sheet to collect drips.



CRUISING

Navtex Updates

The RYA has received a number of complaints about poor Navtex reception in the west of Scotland.

At present the RYA is taking part in discussions with the Irish Authorities about improving the quality of transmissions by utilising a new 490kHz transmitter installed at Malin Head.

The theory would be that the Malin Head transmitter would duplicate the Portpatrick transmissions in terms of data and would help fill in any gaps in coverage.

At present, Malin Head only requires the allocation of a new B1 identity character before it becomes operational.

In addition to this, there are a number of changes to all three UK 490kHz Navtex stations.

These are:

Niton:

0120, 0520, 0920, 1320, 1720, 2120

Cullercoats:

0320, **0720, 1120, 1520, 1920, 2320**

Portpatrick:

0020, 0420, 0820, 1220, 1620, 2020

In addition to this, the Inshore Waters Forecast and outlook will be broadcast four times a day, at the times shown in bold above, but only once at the other locations.

Reports of actual weather conditions, consisting of sea level pressure, wind direction, wind speed and visibility will be broadcast as and when reports are available on any of the six time slots available from each Navtex station. These will be taken from selected MET office sites.

Any strong wind warnings will be highlighted on the Inland Waters Forecast.

He will also be giving a talk on the new rules at Royal Northern sometime in March. This will be open to anyone and it is expected that CYCA will circulate member clubs once a date is fixed. If there is sufficient demand, he will also run a Disputes Procedures course at Royal Northern.

CANAL CRUISING

Inland Waterways set for Busy Programme

An exciting calendar of inland cruises is in prospect this year in Scotland.

Friday 12th June to Sunday 14th June, The Scottish Inland Waterways Association will host the Inland Waterways Association of Ireland for the week end at **Crinan**.

Tuesday 16th June to Saturday 20th June a cruise in convoy will take place from **Fort William to Inverness**. This is to be called "**The Crossing**".

A cruise in convoy from **Carron Sea Lock to Stirling and back** is planned for the week end of **20th/21st June**. Already 20 boat owners have expressed an interest.

The annual **Summit Rally** this year will coincide with the Kirkintilloch Canal Festival on **29th and 30th of August**.

Details below of The Crossing

Calling All Boats!

For 5 days in June 2009, (**16th – 20th June**) the length of the Caledonian Canal will be buzzing with activity!

The Crossing is a unique, five-day flotilla event spanning the entire length of the Caledonian Canal from Fort William to Muirtown basin in Inverness.

Through a programme of water and land-based activities, The Crossing will highlight the culture of the area, the drama of the navigation of the canal, and its many influences on Highland life, with a series of events at key locations along the route of the canal, including music, storytelling and dance.

A concept of British Waterways, **The Crossing** (a reference to the fact that the waterway crosses between the Atlantic and the North Sea) aims to celebrate the history of the Caledonian Canal, its users, its local communities, and the contribution that the Canal has made to the Highland communities, heritage and culture throughout a 200 year history.

UZ Events will develop the programme in collaboration with British Waterways and Highland Council, to ensure that the event is developed to maximise its impact and benefits for the local area.

The event is featured within the Year of Homecoming programme for 2009, and we anticipate that it will attract significant marketing and PR media attention.

Overview of Programme

The content of the project is essentially in two parts: a spectacular flotilla of boats that travels through the Caledonian Canal, and a programme of water and land-based events along the route.

A visually impressive flotilla will be gathered, consisting of a range of vessels that demonstrate not only the current use of the canal, but a variety of historical craft that have used the canal through the ages. The flotilla will be mustered on Tuesday 16th June in Fort William, and will travel the length of the Canal, ending in a spectacular finish at Inverness, in Muirtown's Seaport Marina on Saturday 20th June.

The flotilla will navigate the lock systems, stopping at set locations on the way, where there will be an opportunity to celebrate Highland culture through storytelling, street theatre, family events, music and dancing, including Ceilidhs. Water-based activities will include boats, canoes, kayaks, angling etc. Programme content will be developed to feature themes of the Scottish Enlightenment, particularly in relation to the Canal and the Highlands, alongside Scotland's contribution to contemporary innovation and engineering.

A community programme will be developed with local partners to encourage maximum participation of local people. The programme also, where possible, aims to highlight local professional talent, food and activity providers.

Over 40,000 attendees and visitors are anticipated to enjoy the celebrations.

How to Get Involved

UZ Events and British Waterways are keen to encourage a variety of vessels to engage in the event, and to feature as part of what we hope will be a visually spectacular flotilla– to be enjoyed not only by those who view it from land, but fun for those who participate on the water.

Membership of the flotilla will of course involve a degree of cooperation with the organisers, traveling the canal at a timescale to coordinate with the event timings.

To encourage your participation, we do of course understand the need to offer an incentive.....

- BW have indicated that they will offer **FREE TRANSIT** through the canal to selected participating boats!
- An **entertainment programme** will be developed along the route
- Participating boats and their crews will receive **priority booking** opportunities for any land-based programme activities
- We hope that the event will attract significant **media attention**. Effort will be made to liaise with boat owners to ensure maximum PR exposure where this is appropriate.
